



Nez Perce Education Standard: Evaluating Mastery



#### Record Breaking Average Daily Attendance:

Both schools have maintained over 90% average daily attendance the entire school year!

#### Competitive Go-On Rate:

Students moving on to college within two years after graduation remains competitive with the state average.

The Lapwai School District had the highest number of students enrolled in dual college credit than any other Native district in Idaho.

The Lapwai School District had the highest number of students apply for the Idaho Opportunity Scholarship than any other Native district in Idaho.

#### Plummer-Worley School District:

The Plummer-Worley School District plans to visit our district in June to learn more about our school improvement efforts, curriculum, systems for improving attendance, and changes in policies and procedures.



#### Magna Award:

The Lapwai School District was honored on Sunday, May 31<sup>st</sup> in Philadelphia, PA at the National School Boards Association Annual Conference as a First Place Magna Award Winner. The only winners from Idaho in the award's history and the only Native district to be recognized this year. We won based on the following criteria:

- Removing barriers to achievement for vulnerable or underserved children, based on race, ethnicity, gender, special needs, geography, or socioeconomic status
- Supporting the school board's equity mission and vision for the district
- Exhibiting success over time
- Having longevity and sustainability
- Can be replicated by other school districts with similar conditions and resources

#### Magna Award Publications:

The award was featured in the American School Board Journal, Nimiipuu Tribal Tribune, Lewiston Tribune, and Slate Magazine of the Idaho School Boards Association.



#### School Improvement:

Previously in school improvement status, our clear and shared focus in improving teaching and learning moved our district out of this determination this year. The recent identifications for Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) schools did not include Lapwai this year

#### Idaho State Department of Education:


The Lapwai School District will also be receiving an award and recognition this June at the Indian Education Summit in Boise.

#### Thank You to Our Partners:

Recent awards are recognition of the unique collaboration occurring in the Lapwai School District which includes a dedicated school board and administrators, hardworking instructional staff, and close working relationship and support from the Nez Perce Tribe. We work closely with all Tribal departments including Education, Social Services/Child Protection, Tribal Police, Lapwai Community Coalition, and Nimiipuu Behavioral Health. Recently Nez Perce Tribal Police gifted our district with a student resource officer. We also have an excellent partnership with the city of Lapwai. City Council has included support of education in the majority of their grant applications.

Collin Fehr from LCSC visited students in Mr. Maynes' class on May 14<sup>th</sup> about movement and sport sciences. Our students were very engaged!


