Staff Qualifications

School districts receiving Title I funds are required to notify parents they may request information regarding the professional qualifications of their child's classroom teacher(s). We are prepared to celebrate our highly qualified staff and share their accomplishments with you on request.

As a parent of a student attending a school receiving federal program funds, you have the right to know:

- > Is my child's teacher licensed to teach the grades and subject(s) assigned?
- ➤ Is my child's teacher teaching with a provisional license, meaning the state waived requirements for my child's teacher?
- ➤ What is the college major of my child's teacher?
- What degree or degrees does my child's teacher hold?

Title IX-A: Information for Parents & Families

If you or your family are in a temporary or inadequate living situation due to a loss of housing, we can help.

If you are living in any of the following situations:

- > Shared housing with other friends or families
- > Runaway/homeless youth, and students who are not living with a parent or legally court-appointed guardian
- > Temporary or transitional housing
- > Emergency and domestic violence shelters
- Motels or hotels
- > Campgrounds or inadequate trailer homes
- Substandard housing (homes without heat, water, or working appliances)
- Cars, abandoned buildings, parks, the streets or other public spaces

We may be able to help you or your child:

- > Enroll in school
- Remain in your school if you move to another area
- With transportation to and from school
- > Access to meal programs
- Social referrals
- Other services

Title IX-A: Information for Parents & Families

What are your rights under the law?

You or your McKinney-Vento eligible children have the right to:

- > Receive a free, appropriate public education
- > Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment
- > Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents
- Enroll in the local school; or continue attending the school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is your preference. *If the school district believes that the school you select is not in the best interest of your children, then the district must provide you with a written explanation of its position and inform you of your right to appeal its decision
- > Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if you request this
- ➤ Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to your children's needs. Children with special education needs between the ages of 3 and 21 are eligible to receive special needs services. If you believe your child may be eligible, contact your school or the district Special Education office.
