

Wildcat Mathematicians


The Wildcat Scholars in Mrs. Baldwin's class are learning to write and say multidigit numbers, billion to thousandths.
















Keenan Henry and Mr. Lattuada are pictured repairing a catapult in Construction Math.






Restorative Justice

Restorative practices are focused on relationships with the goal of building strong connections that promote positive behavior and a positive classroom climate. The approach provides structures and practices to set clear classroom expectations, as well as providing language for engaging students in problem solving and self reflection when problems arise. Successful school-wide implementation requires ongoing professional development, teacher buy-in, support from administration, coaching, and practice.

The Superintendent has been riding bus routes to review safety reminders and rules. Way to go Wildcats Scholars for respectful, responsible and safe bus behavior!




