Dear Parent/Guardian,

As a result of the federal No Child Left Behind Act, your child can receive free tutoring in math, reading, and language arts. Lapwai Elementary has been identified as a Title I high priority school. You may choose a Supplemental Educational Services (SES) program for your child. These free tutoring programs are provided outside of regular school hours. At this time, all of the approved providers in our area are either in Lewiston or online computer based instruction. The district does not provide transportation to Lewiston.

A list of approved programs is enclosed along with a brief description of the services, qualifications, and demonstrated effectiveness of the providers. These programs have been approved by the Idaho State Department of Education.

When considering a program you may want to ask these questions:

- When and where will the tutoring take place?
- What type of instruction will the tutor use (small group, one-on-one, or the computer)?
- If it is a computer-based instruction, what are the technology requirements?
- What are the tutors' qualifications?

The teacher must be fully certified as a licensed teacher by the Michigan Department of Education or meet the parameters stated by the Department of Education as a paraprofessional. Most tutorial staff are degreed and certified in the subject area being taught or have passed the Michigan Subject Area Test for Teacher Certification or the Michigan paraprofessional exam. Employment is contingent upon passing a physical exam, drug test, and criminal background check. When hired, staff receives a minimum of 60 hours of training in the program and returning tutors receive annual refresher training.
