Welcome to a new school year. This letter details Lapwai School District progress toward state Reading, Mathematical, and Language Arts goals and reviews options available to some students.

Each year, all districts are required to reach goals in Reading, Mathematics, and Language Arts. Districts must meet the proficiency targets in 41 different areas within these subjects. Lapwai School District is in *School Improvement Year 7* because the following categories did not meet the academic targets:

In keeping with the No Child Left Behind [NCLB] law, the Lapwai School District may have education options available for individual students. Feel free to consult the District Superintendent on these options.

- Working collaboratively in leadership teams to align district-level best practices with the *Nine Characteristics of High Performing Schools*, a research-based plan for school improvement.
- Simultaneously plan and implement initiatives to increase student achievement, ultimately raising the bar for all students and closing achievement gaps among students.
- District will use data-based evidence to monitor results, to make instructional decisions and for accountability.
